

SPACE JUNK...

Dead satellites and other Debris.



Waste has already begun to pile up in low Earth orbit. In fact, of all the man-made objects in low orbit, an estimated 95 percent is junk. Aside from dead satellites, space junk is composed

of spent rocket stages and miscellaneous items left behind by astronauts. The trashed materials encircling Earth now number at least 7,000 large objects. Garbage in orbit poses no direct threat to people on earth, but it can endanger any satellite put into a low orbit.

Collisions with trackable objects are not the only concern. There are about 40,000 small untrackable objects in orbit, as well as a 100 billion minute ones (paint chips, for example). A crash with even a small object in space would involve a collision velocity of about 22,000 miles per hour. At such high speeds, a half-inch-long piece of metal would cause an impact as explosive as the detonation of a hand grenade.

Once garbage is put into space, it is nearly impossible to remove it. The only way to clean up low Earth orbit, therefore, is to prevent garbage from getting there in the first place.

The three Great Pyramids and Orion.

Of the Great Pyramids at Giza in Egypt, the biggest has a base of 230m and a height of 147m. 
