Summer Festivals

Summer seems to bring out the "athlete" in us. And many festivals around the world at this time of year encourage a certain physicality from the participants Matsuyama's Summer **Festival** as experienced by the dancers and bands who parade along Okaido each year, could be seen as one example. Here are some other ofunusual. examples physically demanding, summer festivals from other parts the world:

The Cheese Rolling Festival: People of



Gloucester, UK love their cheese so much that they are literally willing to break their necks to get some! In early summer, some of these hardy folk line up at the top of Cooper's Hill near Brockworth.

Thousands come to watch, including an ambulance crew to tend bruised and broken bodies after the race is run. The idea is to send a 3.5kg round of Double Gloucester Cheese rolling

down this very steep hill at about 112 km per hour. The participants charge after it, running, jumping, rolling, even flying, until they reach the bottom. The first one down, wins. And, the prize? The roll of cheese, of course!

A Wife Carrying Event: This festival-race has been held in Finland each year for 17 years, the last 14 years as a "World Championship"!

It is held in Sonkajärvi and is believed to go back to an early 19th century tradition that started with "wife stealing"! Thousands come to watch and cheer on the contestants. The race is over a 253.5 mtr obstacle course, and the runners are forbidden to drop their "wives" at any time during the race. Their prize? Their "wife's" weight in beer!



Baby Jumping Festival: This one is held in Castillo de Murcia in northern Spain and has a more serious tone to it than the other two here. The tradition goes back to 1620. It

has been rated as one of the most dangerous festivals in the world, but the intention is for the baby's wellbeing; the idea is to ensure the babies have a safe and healthy life. It is also meant to cleanse them of "original sin" and protect them against illness and evil spirits. The jumpers dress as the Colacho, representing of the Devil, and jump over as many as half a dozen babies at a time – group cleansing?
