Anne Frank

"Anne" Annelies Marie Frank, (12 June 1929 early March 1945) between thirteen to fifteen years old, survived most of World War II with her family (Otto, Edith and Anne's elder sister Margot) hiding out in a "Secret



Annex" (Achterhuis) her father's at premises Amsterdam. company in Netherlands. Also hiding with the Franks was another family, Herman and Auguste Van Pels and their son Peter, aged sixteen, and also a dentist (Fritz Pfeffer). Due to Otto's business acumen and many connections the group was able to obtain food stamps and rations and was also able to make money in order to buy food which was brought to them daily or weekly by any of six close and trusted work colleagues.

While in hiding, Anne wrote a diary detailing her experience living in the "Secret Annex" - "Our food is miserable. Dry bread and coffee substitute breakfast. Dinner: spinach or lettuce for a fortnight on end, and potatoes, twenty centimeters long, and tasting sweet and rotten."

adulthood: "I know what I want, I have a goal, an opinion, I have a religion and love. Let me be myself then I am satisfied. I know that I'm a woman, a woman with inward strength and plenty of courage." The intimate relationship she developed with Peter: "Mummy thinks Peter is in love with me, I only wish he were, then we'd be guits and really be able to get to know each other." And her philosophies about life and people: "I don't want followers, but friends, admirers who fall not for a flattering smile but for what one does and for one's character. I know quite well the circle around me would be much smaller. But what does that matter, as long as one still keeps a few sincere friends?"

The last entry in her diary is Tuesday 1, August 1944. Tragically, on August 4, 1944 German Uniformed Police (Grune Polizei) raided the "Secret Annex". Everyone in hiding was immediately sent to German and Dutch concentration camps where all died except for Anne's father. Anne's diary was later found in the "Secret Annex" by Miep Gies (one of the six people who helped them remain hidden for two years) among a pile of old books, magazines and newspapers on the floor. When Anne's father returned, Miep gave him Anne's diary and he had it published. Her now world famous diary has
